Buying Tickets

Ticket and Delivery Terms

Illuminate Adelaide uses digital mobile tickets which should arrive in your inbox 24-48 hours ahead of the purchased event session. Venue staff will scan your mobile tickets from your phone for entry.

The starting time of each show is on your ticket. Latecomers may not be allowed entry. Illuminate Adelaide has provided approximate durations for each event (subject to change) where possible. We will continue to update our website with extra information as it comes. We would recommend arriving early to your event to ensure you're on time.

Purchase and Payment Methods

Illuminate Adelaide is a cashless event. You cannot use cash to purchase tickets or food and beverages at Illuminate Adelaide events.

VISA, Mastercard, and debit cards are accepted.

American Express and Diners Card are not accepted.

Come Prepared

Illuminate Adelaide events are all-weather events and will go ahead, rain or shine.

We recommend wearing suitable clothing and footwear for the temperature and weather.

You may also like to bring:

- Ear plugs and/or noise cancelling headphones
- Comfort items like fidget tools
- Any necessary medication
- Refillable drink bottle
- Companion Card, if applicable (if you need to book a Companion Card ticket, Box Office staff may request to see it)

Parking

There is street and car parking across Adelaide city during Illuminate Adelaide. We recommend carpooling and booking ahead to secure a discounted parking space with UPark.

UPark is providing Illuminate Adelaide patrons access to a **20% discount** off pre-bookings on night parking during Illuminate Adelaide. Bookings can be made a maximum of 7 days prior, with the code **ILLUMINATE**. Learn more on our website [here](#).

Public Transport

Illuminate Adelaide takes place across the city, and easily accessible by public transport, bus, tram, and train.

Adelaide Metro offers a dedicated bus, train, and tram network. Choose the option which works best for you while accessing timetables and tickets via the [Adelaide Metro planner](#).

If you are coming from the city or North Adelaide, there is a Free City Connector bus service, the 98A and 98C. Services operate every 15 minutes on weekdays and 30 minutes on weekends. Click [here](#) for Adelaide Metro's website route map and timetable.

The last Free City Connector bus on weekdays runs at 7:00pm, with slightly longer run-times on Friday and Saturday until 9:00pm. For all bus timetables, visit the Adelaide Metro website [here](#).

There is also a **Free City Tram** service. The closest tram stop to *Night Visions* is the "Botanic Gardens" stop on North Terrace. You can also utilise the tram stops between "Botanic Gardens", and "Adelaide Railway Station" for *City Lights*.

By train, the Adelaide Railway Station located on North Terrace provides access to city-based events, whilst the Adelaide Showground Railway Station on the corner of Anzac Highway and Greenhill Road, is nearest to *Augmented Games* at the Adelaide Showground.

Taxis

Taxi ranks are located on King William Street, outside the Casino and Railway Station, and in other prominent locations around the city.

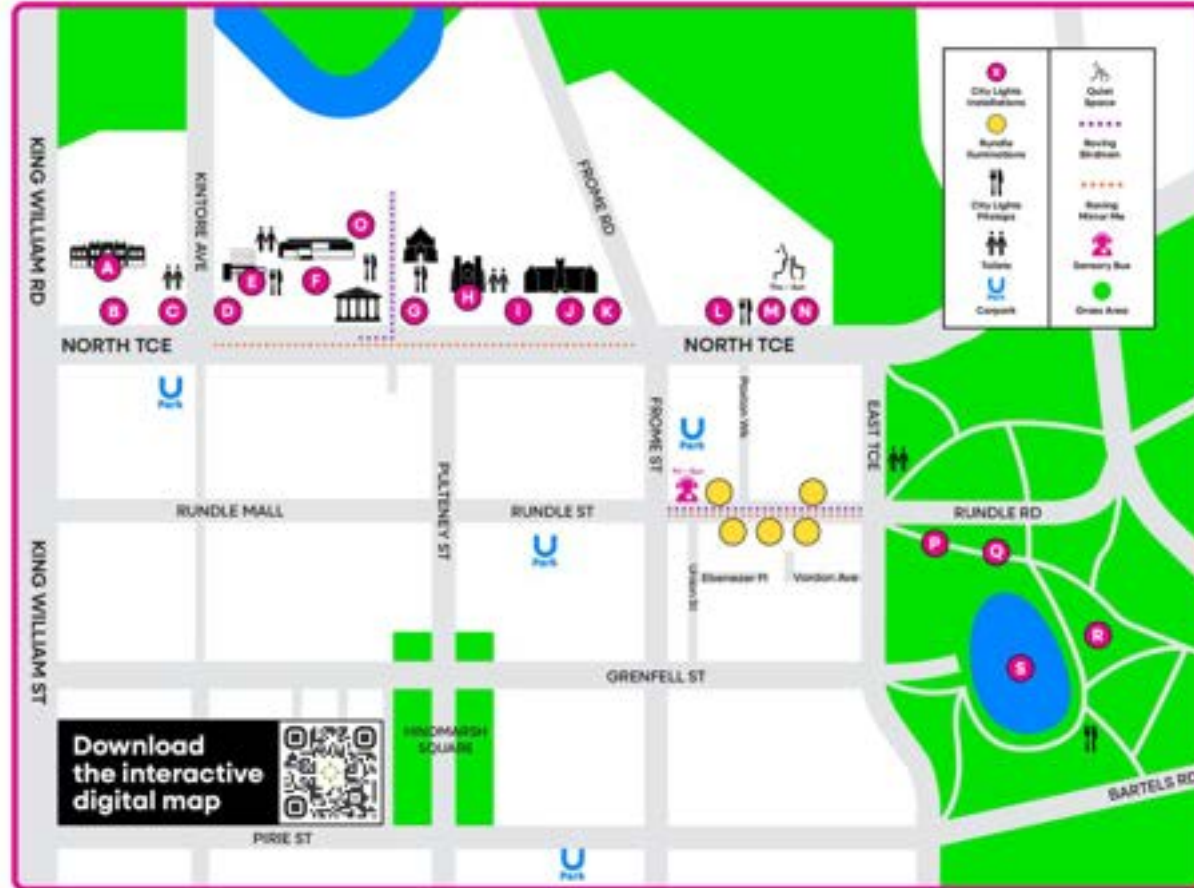

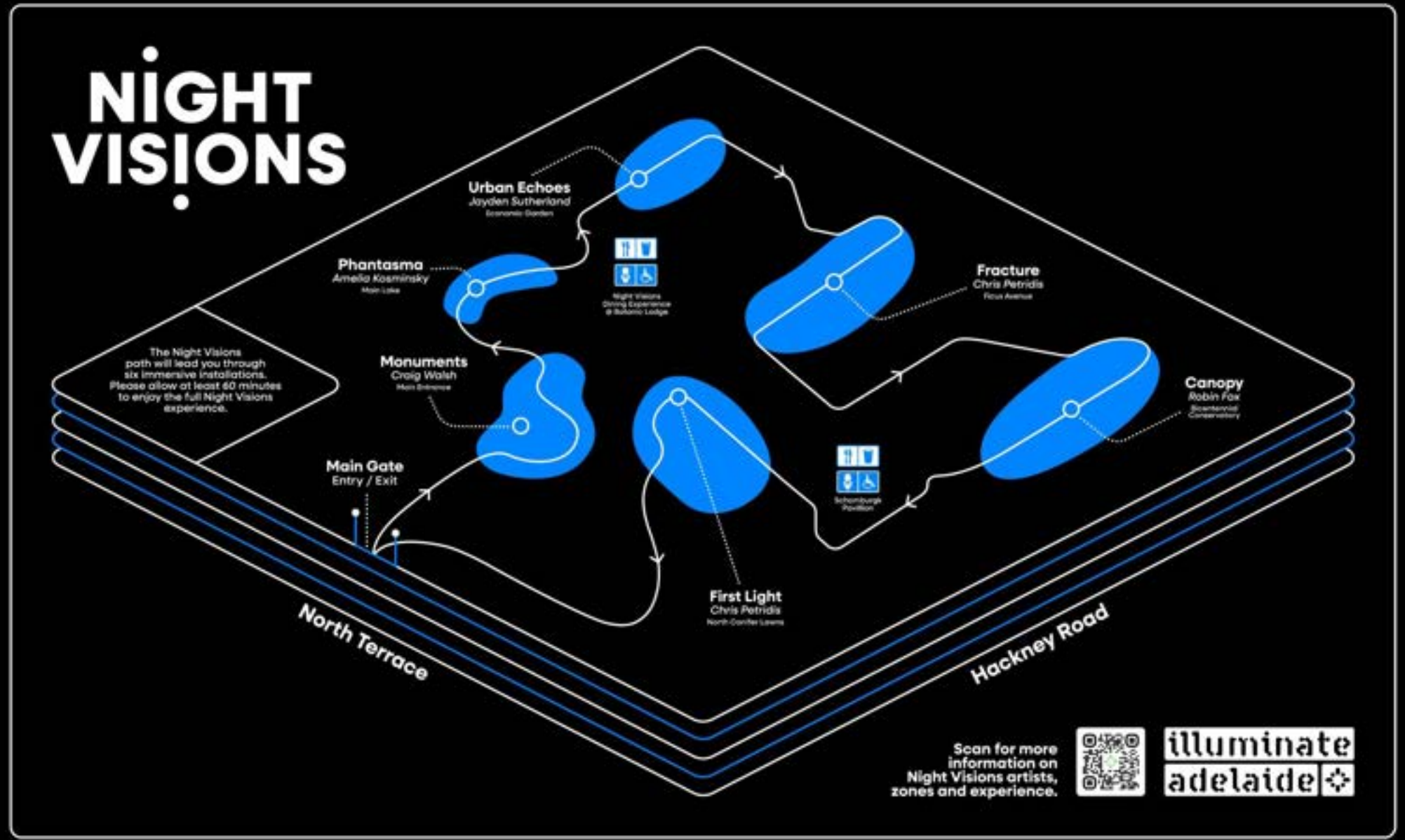

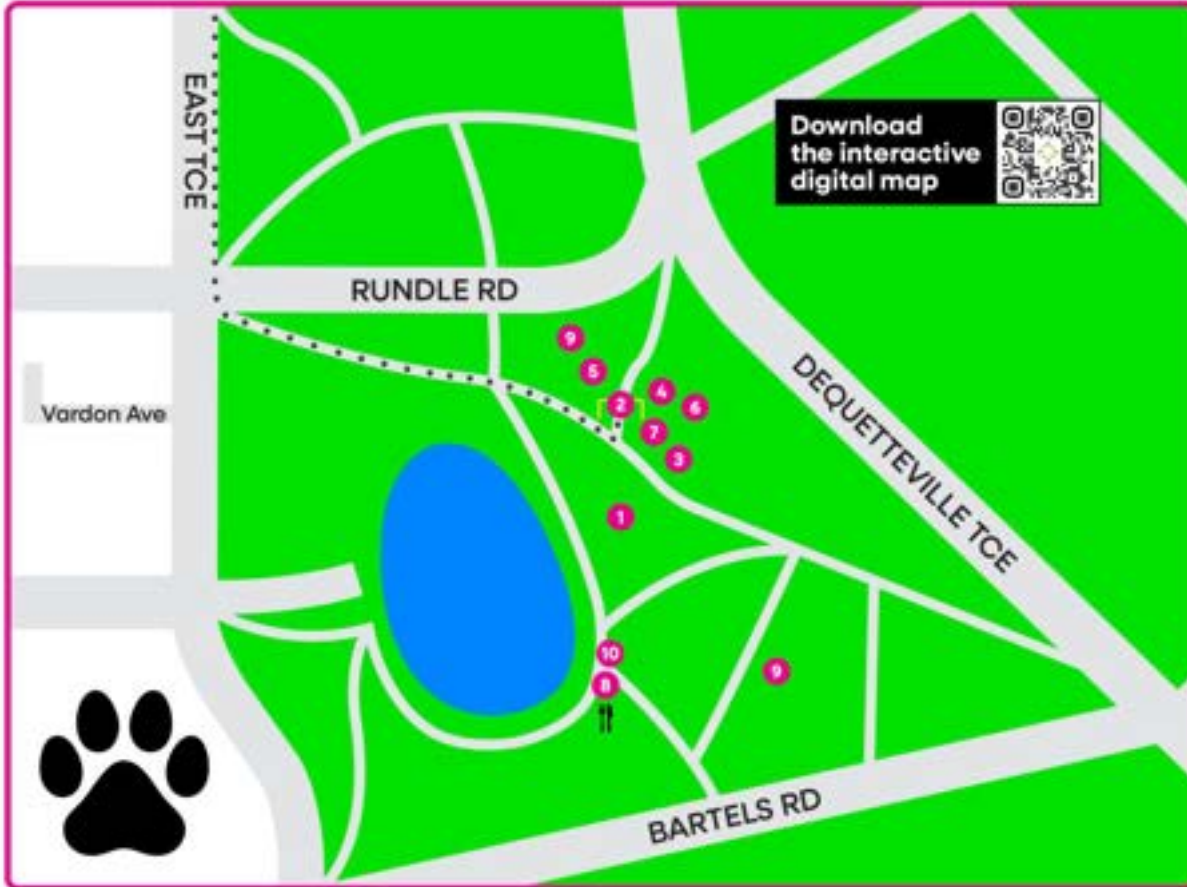

Illuminate Adelaide has a Sensory Space and a Quiet Space at two separate locations.

These areas are dedicated to provide a calm and comfortable zone for visitors who may feel overwhelmed by crowds, noise, or sensory stimulation. Everyone is welcome in these spaces.

Staff

Staff wear Illuminate Adelaide branded clothing, and at *City Lights*, green hi-vis vests. At *Augmented Games*, they will be in black clothing with an Illuminate Adelaide green lanyard. Staff can help you with any questions you have at the events.

Some staff are roving around the site, whilst some are stationed at different locations. Ticketing staff will be present in the Box Offices during opening hours.

Many Illuminate Adelaide staff have completed Access2Arts Disability Access and Inclusion training, as well as safety briefings.

Staff have also completed the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower awareness training and learned about inclusive communication from Novita.

Please note, some venues will be staffed by their own venue employees.

Passenger drop off and Ridley Gate main entry is off Goodwood Road. Paid parking off Rose Terrace has accessible parking bays and is 400m from the Ridley Centre. Tram and bus stops are nearby on Goodwood Rd.

City Lights Pitstops

City Lights Pitstops are available along the event route, providing opportunities to purchase light food and warm beverages. Pitstops are located at **Art Gallery of South Australia, State Library of South Australia, LUMEN Bar, Lot Fourteen, and Rymill Kiosk**. Browse the venues and their offerings on our [website](#).

Access Information

Most Pitstop venues have step-free access. Please note there are two steps up to the AGSA_eat food stall. Orders can be made via QR code from the tables nearby.

Sensory Information

Wait times or queuing may be required when purchasing food and drink. There will be smells associated with the food being served, and it may be loud in these spaces.

Facilities

All Pitstop venues have toilets and an accessible toilet available.

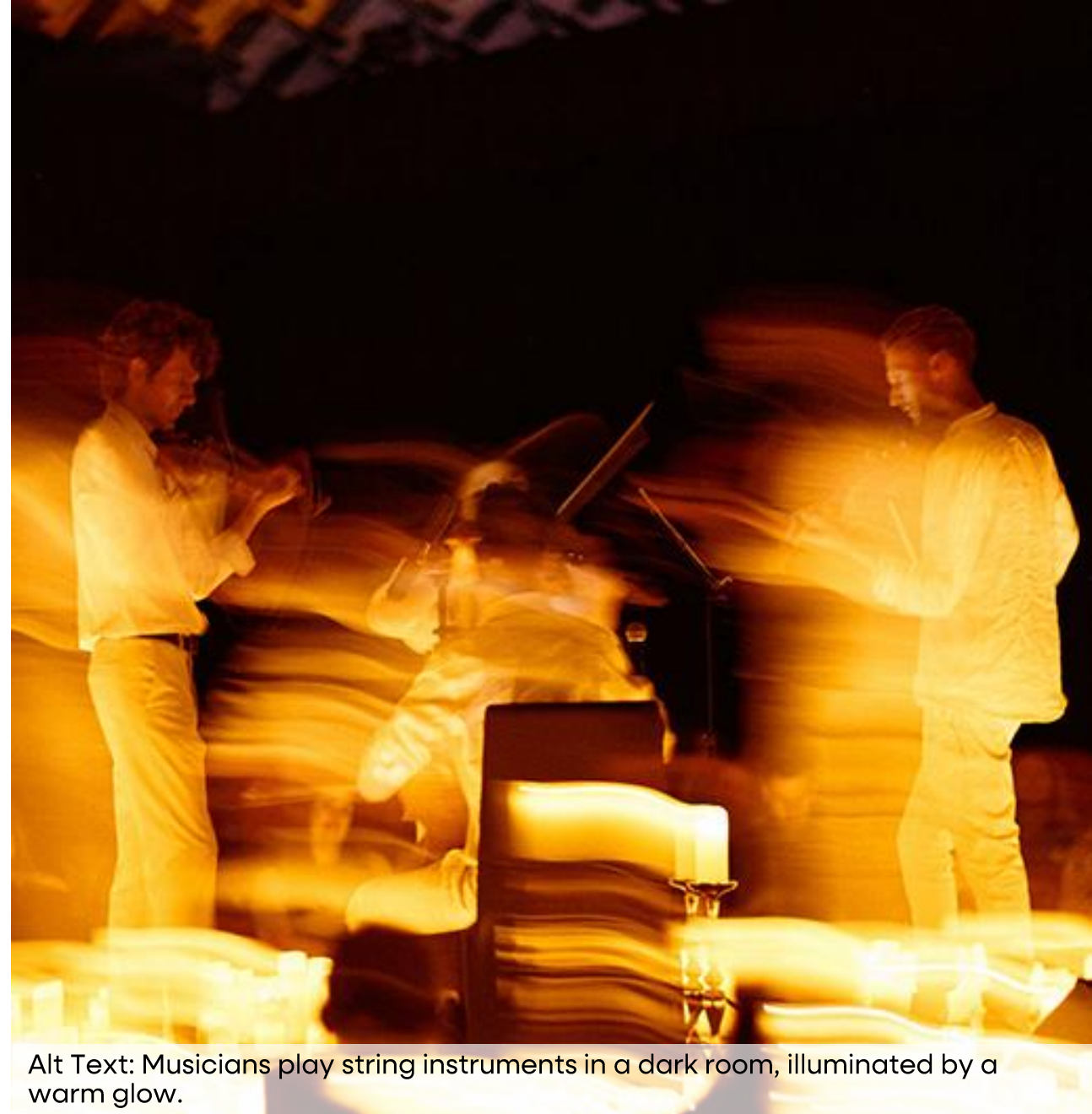

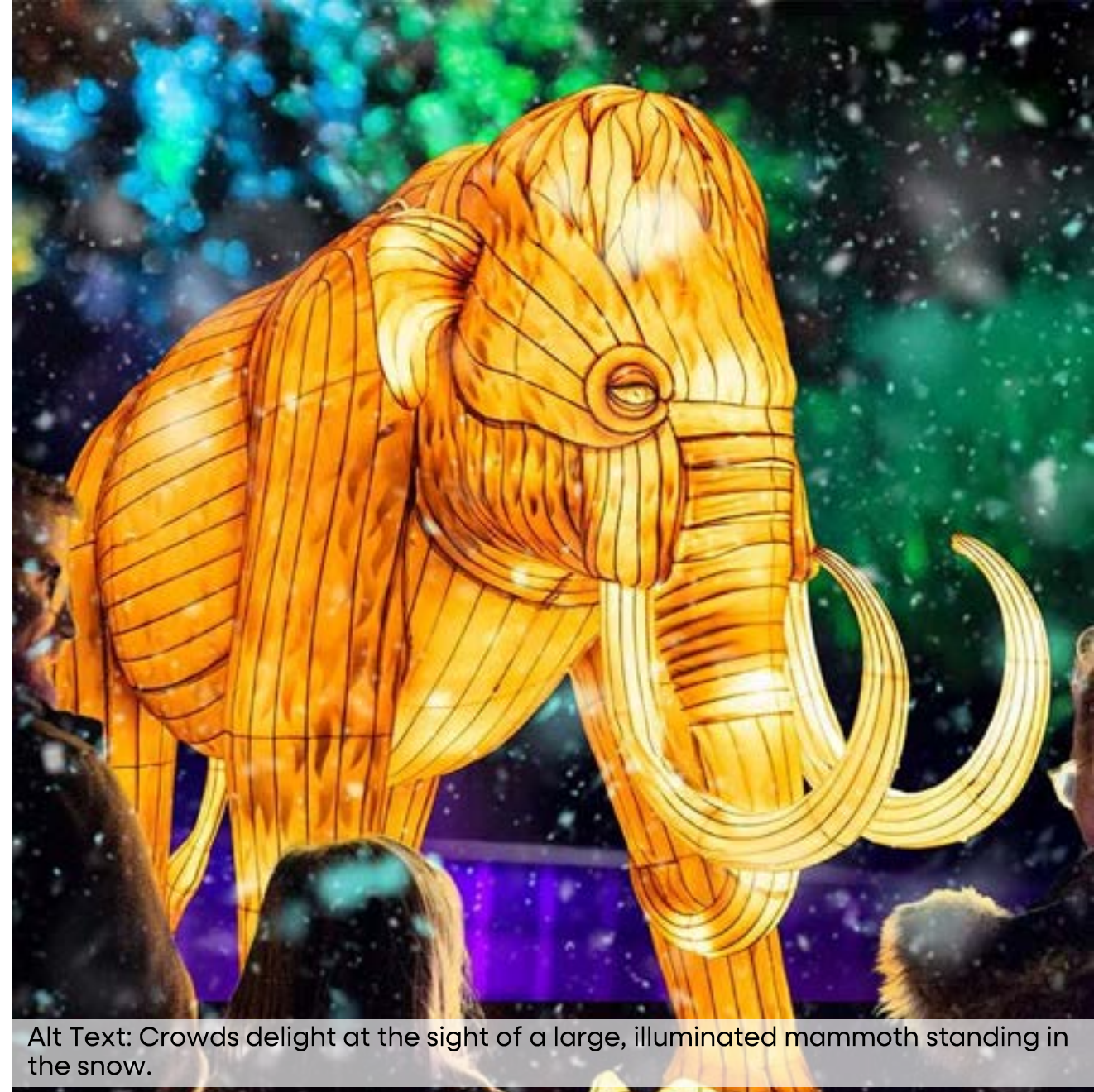
